



Chronic Disease Prevention Specialist

Manage MTUPP and GWHIC programs:

- Partner with Cascade County Public Health Chronic Disease Specialist to build community-level capacity and ensure they have updated AI materials and quit-line info
- Training and webinars
- Monthly reporting and calls with MT DPHHS and Rocky Mountain Tribal Leaders Council (RMTLC), and Little Shell Tribal Council
- Community outreach and engagement
 - Guidance from Elders and Cultural Revitalization Coordinator
- Teaching and instruction of traditional art and culture through activities and events
 - Advocate for use Ojibwe language, traditional ceremonies, story-telling, etc.
- Invite Tribal Council members to community outreach activities
- Participate in/creation of community events

- Assist with Indian Education activities
- Create events/activities for at the very least: Great American Smoke Out, Red Ribbon Week, Through with Chew, Kick Butts Day, World No Tobacco Day and American Indian Heritage Day
- Participate in Community Coalitions
- Engage youth in events/activities
- Provide education on Clean Indoor Air to Tribal Members
- Implement/Adopt policies around smoke exposure protection
- Take part in the broader MTDPHHS media campaigns for smoking cessation and tobacco-free MT (place signage, posters, fliers, share social media, etc.)
- Develop contacts with private and public housing facilities to provide info, education, signage, etc. on smoke-free housing policies.
- Partners with Boys and Girls Club,
- Work with the Housing Director and Health Director to advance our programs and mission.
- Collaborate with area schools – provide info and education on e-cigarettes, tobacco-free policies, chronic disease prevention

- Create media campaigns (earned and paid media) for chronic disease prevention (PSA, social media, radio and TV ads, etc.)
- Promote the quit-line
